




FINANCIAL SUMMARY FOR 2017


Jackson County CASA, Inc. is funded through public, private and foundation support. United Way for Jackson & George Counties has funded our program since 1999.

Revenue for the 2017 calendar year was \$154,739.

In 2017, 88.65% of total expenses was used for our program operations such as recruiting and training quality advocates for the volunteers to serve our children, 3.57% toward fundraising efforts, and leaving 7.78% toward Administrative cost. Total expenditures for the calendar year was \$15,548.

JANUARY

The CASA staff joined CASA MS Director Mary Purvis and representatives from CASA of Hancock County and CASA of Harrison County on January 12 for CASA Mississippi Capitol Day in Jackson, where we spent the morning meeting with



State Legislators and their staff, helping to bring awareness of the CASA mission throughout our state. We attended the *Gulf Coast Legislative Reception*, hosted the previous evening at the *Trade Mart* in Jackson, which provided an opportunity to meet face-to-face with our legislators, key public officials and opinion leaders to further our mission. More importantly, it was the perfect chance to discuss with them the proposed legislation, House Bill 1213, that would provide the needed explanation of our work on behalf of child victims of abuse and neglect and would legitimize our work. January 13, we met with the CASA Mississippi Board of Directors for a *Strategic Planning Retreat*, facilitated by Nancy Burris Perett, at the MS College School of Law.

FEBRUARY



February proved to be a very busy month with many speaking engagements to promote our mission and upcoming events and even for volunteer recruitment. Frances began on February 6 with St. Paul's United Methodist Women and the Mosaic Church on the 10th. The United Way campaign kicked off on February 7 with our first speaking engagement for the campaign at the West Jackson County Utilities. To promote the *Gulfport Rotary Walk* to benefit the coastal CASA programs, Frances spoke to the Pascagoula Rotary on the 1st and the Ocean Springs Rotary on the 8th. There were many speaking engagements that promoted our upcoming

MARCH

United Way for Jackson & George Counties and Jackson County Literacy Council sponsored literacy week for children March 6 – 10. Volunteers and staff visited the Jackson County Head Start Centers and read stories to the children. Volunteers also collected new or "gently read" children's books for ages birth to 18. Over 2000 books were donated to the Excel by 5 communities in Moss Point, Ocean Springs and Pascagoula, Boys & Girls Clubs of Jackson County, Jackson County CASA, and Mississippi Gulf Coast YMCA.





The Rotary Club of Gulfport sponsored a half-marathon walk to benefit the CASA programs of Hancock, Harrison and Jackson Counties on March 17. Participating walkers could choose their starting point, the foot of the Pass Christian Bridge or the Biloxi bridge. Our very own Frances Allsup walked 7 miles while Adrian McCullum managed to complete the 13-mile walk, which ended at Jones Park in Gulfport.

Our second annual CASA Blues was hosted on March 3 at the Grand Magnolia Ballroom in Pascagoula. Thanks to our Presenting Sponsor, Bozo's Seafood Market & Deli, the many additional supporting sponsors and all who attended, it was an amazing success. This year's event honored Jackson County leaders Dorothy Shaw and Joe Martin. It was held at the Grand Magnolia Ballroom with Richard Lucas as Master of Ceremony and Honorable Michael Watson, Jr. as Keynote Speaker. Honorable Sharon Sigalas addressed the guests on behalf of the children we serve. Our special guests were Miss Mississippi, Laura Lee Lewis, and Schooner, Biloxi Shuckers mascot. Returning to provide the music for the evening was N2 Blue Band, featuring CASA Volunteer Sam Owens on the drums. The Pascagoula-Moss Point Junior Auxiliary assisted with the Silent Auction and Marta Williams, Ft. Bayou Wine & Spirits, supplied the beverages.





In late March, CASA was notified that we were approved for a \$2,500 grant from Wells Fargo Bank. The grant request was for funding needed to support our program. Also in late March, we were awarded a \$10,000 VOCA grant for the specific purpose of purchasing office equipment. This wonderful opportunity allowed us to purchase some much-needed equipment for the office.





APRIL

April 3, Jackson County Board of Supervisors proclaimed the month of April as Child Abuse Prevention Month. Brenda Lancaster from CASA and Sherba Hinton and Stephen Jackson from CPS stood by Frances as she accepted the proclamation from Board President Troy Ross and expressed appreciation for the County's support.





For the past several months CASA has been enlisting support for House Bill 1213, which would both legitimize and provide consistency for our organization by clarifying CASA's work on behalf of child victims of abuse and neglect in Mississippi. April 12, H. B. No. 1213 was signed into law, authorizing the Youth Court to utilize volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocates in abuse and neglect cases.

April 20, we hosted "Working Together: Piecing the Puzzle Together for Children" at the Pascagoula Country Club. The CASA staff and several volunteers joined the staff of JC Department of Child Protection Services for a meeting designed to bring about a better understanding of the roles of each organization and to improve working relations. The meeting was facilitated by JC CASA Board President, Marilyn Montgomery. Guest speakers for the morning session included Johnnie Bernhard of Ocean Springs, author of *A Good Girl* and former JC CASA Board President, Seth Shannon, Chief of Staff for the Commissioner of Mississippi Department of Child Protection

Services, Mary Purvis, Executive Director for CASA Mississippi, Inc., and Honorable Sharon Sigalas, Jackson County Youth Court Judge. Following lunch, the attendees participated in a question and answer session, guided by representatives from CASA and CPS and facilitated by Amy Guidry, CASA Volunteer Coordinator.



National Volunteer Recognition Week was celebrated on April 23 – 29. It honors all volunteers who are working on behalf of others without being motivated by financial or material gain. The staff of JC CASA would like to take this opportunity to express our heartfelt thanks to each of our dedicated Advocates, Friends of CASA, Arms of CASA and community supporters for everything they do for us and the children we serve. As always, thank you for making a difference in the lives of the children in need.





MAY

This is the first time we have had a month that did not have any prescheduled events or activities. May provided some much-needed time for the CASA staff to catch-up on things and to prepare for upcoming training and the many events scheduled for the next few months.

JUNE

The Dixie Dart Club hosted a charity tournament on June 4 at the VFW in D'Iberville to benefit Jackson County CASA. On June 25, Frances Allsup and Volunteer Katie Allsup attended the club's meeting where they were presented with a monetary donation from the proceeds of the tournament. They also accepted a donation of back-to-school supplies collected by the club members for our CASA children.





Summer Fun Day for our CASA children was organized by Volunteer Beverly Goff and her husband Victor and Echo and Bryan Hamilton owners of H&H farms in Moss Point, the location of the special event. The Fun Day was held Saturday, June 17. Even though the weather was not perfect, it did not stop the fun. The children and guests enjoyed horseback riding and many other activities including a bouncy castle, cornhole, horseshoes, sack races, face painting and more. The chance of winning a door prizes added to the excitement. The rain brought the picnic lunch inside. Each child received an *I Survived Summer Fun Day* t-shirt. Events like these provide a wonderful opportunity for us to see the children enjoying traditional family fun, laughing, smiling and simply having a grand time! It was truly a heartwarming event.

For the first time in several years, volunteer recruitment was a struggle. We diligently searched for new and innovative methods to help bolster our recruitment efforts. On June 19, our first Volunteer Training for 2017 began with only five candidates scheduled to participate. Due to personal conflicts, we started training with only three. Our next scheduled training is set for September.







JULY

Paradigm Investment Group, parent company of the local Hardee's restaurants, held a major fundraising event for our program. Participating Hardee's restaurants in Jackson County, located in Gautier, Moss Point and Pascagoula, accepted donations on our behalf throughout the month of July. SEPTEMBER

Our fall pre-service training was held throughout the month with eight participants. The induction ceremony was held October 2 for the participants and the two participants from the previous training. The United Way Campaign got underway at the Kick-Off event on September 8 and the staff busily prepared for the many campaign events to come.







OCTOBER



Generally, October is busy with preparations for our Taters for Tots fundraiser. This year, we had additional fundraisers and activities that made it even busier. It started off as Frances and Tommy Jackson from Cornerstone Restaurant, went for an interview on WXXV to kick-off the media campaign for our Taters for Tots event. The Dixie Dart Association hosted their annual Charity Tournament on October 14 and selected JC CASA as their charity of choice. Biloxi-Ocean Springs Junior Auxiliary provided Halloween baskets for many of our CASA

children. Coldwell Banker Alfonso Realty of Gulfport hosted a Drawdown on October 25 to support the Coastal CASA programs of Hancock, Harrison and Jackson Counties.

NOVEMBER

November was very busy as we began preparing for the Christmas season. But the highlight of the month was Mass Adoption Day which was held on November 27. Jackson County Child Protection Services invited us to host a reception for the families that participated in this special day. Of the 13 children adopted, 7 were CASA children.
