Foster Care Review

County Conferences are held every six months to discuss and review the permanency plan of the child/children in foster care. Your attendance and input is requested. The review is **NOT** a court hearing, however, the testimony delivered during the conference will be provided to the Court to aid in making decisions about the child's best interest. **Please contact the CASA staff if you are not able to attend.**

To maintain your CASA standing you are required to complete 12 hours of In-Service training each year. Be sure to include any completed In-Service hours on your monthly reports. Spilled Milk, based on a true story, is a novel by K.L. Randis that is available for checkout throughout the month. Brooke Nolan is a battered child who makes an anonymous phone call to social services about the escalating brutality in her home. When they jeopardize her safety, condemning her to keep her father's secret, it's a glass of spilled milk at the dinner table that forces her to speak about the cruelty she's been hiding. Brooke then battles a broken system that pushers to keep her father in the home. She risks losing the support of family, coming to the realization that some people simply do not want to be saved. *Spilled Milk* is a novel of shocking narrative, triumph, and resiliency.
