Latest Program Statistics

JC CASA is a volunteer–powered organization that advocates for the abused and neglected children of Jackson County. We have an amazing group of dedicated volunteers that provide a voice for these children throughout their court process. As of December 31, 2021, **110 Volunteers** have served **217 children** from **127 families** with **5,091 donated hours of service during the 2021 calendar year.**

2022 Volunteer Training Begins



The winter pre-service training for volunteers wishing to join the Jackson County CASA team has gotten off to a wonderful start for 2022. The class is very diverse and eager to learn all the skills and information needed to become a successful volunteer who can provide the voice of a child who has suffered from abuse and/or neglect. A special thank you to our veteran volunteers who were eager and willing to share their own case experiences when those in training contacted them. This is always one of the activities that makes a tremendous impact on the trainees and answers a lot of their questions/concerns. These folks are currently working through the sample cases and will do Optima training before induction. They are really looking forward to working their first case and doing the court observations. We are anticipating at least eight new volunteers and one transfer will be joining the CASA team by late February. They are equally excited about meeting additional CASA volunteers at events and continuing education activities throughout the year. The next training session (spring training) will begin on Tuesday, March 22.
