We congratulate Elijah's Closet for receiving the \$20,000 grant which will allow this amazing resource agency to assist families by purchasing beds for children in the foster care system and those at risk of entering the system.

Continuing Education Opportunities

Reminder— to maintain your active CASA standing, you are required to complete <u>12 hours</u> of Continuing Education training each year. Be sure to include any completed Continuing Education hours on your monthly activity reports that are submitted in OPTIMA.

This month's continuing education opportunity will be held on **June 14th** at **10 am** at Citizens Bank in Pascagoula. **Samantha Kalahar**, Site Director with **First Place for Youth**, will present an informative program aimed at supporting foster youth as they work to build the skills they need to make a successful transition to self-sufficiency and responsible adulthood. Currently, transition-age youth represent one of the most marginalized populations. At risk of intergenerational cycles of poverty, they are highly vulnerable to homelessness, unemployment, incarceration, the challenges of early parenthood, and dropping out of school. The **Mississippi Youth Voice** program provides a forum for youth leaders 18 - 26 years of age to advocate for those who have lived in foster care. It offers the opportunities to develop leadership skills and make real changes on the state level to provide resources for foster youth and those transitioning out of care. Make plans to attend this upcoming one-hour session to learn how CASA volunteers, CPS and the court staff

can assist and support the 90 percent of youth ages 18-21 who leave custody by their 18th birthday.
